Your Voice Matters! Two District Seats Open in District D & E

SR is looking for activists who wish to run for one of two seats up for election on the California State Retirees Board of Directors. The CSR Board of Directors is the governing body of California State Retirees and usually meets three times per year at locations throughout the state. Board member duties include attending Board meetings, helping to coordinate chapter activities, helping chapter presidents and members understand the issues affecting member welfare, participating in political action and providing overall leadership. The terms for Board members in Districts D and E will conclude at the first CSR Board of Directors meeting in 2024. An election in each of the districts will be conducted only if more than one eligible candidate has consented to serve by the November 15, 2023, filing date. Candidates may also submit a brief 200-word statement regarding their qualifications. The election coordinator reserves the right to disallow any statement material that is considered inaccurate. Ballots in the contested race(s) will be sent to the electorate December 1, 2023, and are due at CSR Headquarters by January 2, 2024. District directors are elected by chapter members within their respective districts.

To be eligible to run, you must be a member in good standing. Candidates must also reside within the district holding the election and in a chapter assigned to the district. Vincent Herrera currently holds the district director position for District D, representing Chapters 8, 13, 14, and 19. Keith Umemoto holds the district director position for District E, representing Chapters 2,15, and 165. If you are interested in running you must file a Candidate Consent Form, located on this page, by November 15, 2023. Access Your Health Care

Our health plans provided answers to the following frequently asked questions so members who've been impacted by a disaster have access to their health care, can find outof-area health care, replace missing medical IDs, and more:

- * If I am displaced or sheltering at home how do I access routine or urgent care?
- How will my health plan ensure that my care will be covered during this emergency?
- If my health plan ID card is missing, how can I get it replaced?
- How can I update my permanent or temporary address?
- How can I access my prescriptions?

Register for myCalPERS

myCalPERS is your gateway to conduct business electronically with us and access real-time details about your CalPERS account. If you don't already have a myCalPERS account, visit Using myCalPERS for step-by-step instructions on how to register for your account.

Update Your Mailing Address

If you've been displaced, ensure we have your current contact information by following the instructions below based on your membership type.

Active Employees: Notify your personnel office of your address change and they will update your information with us.

Retirees: If you have your monthly benefit payment mailed to your home, notify us of your new address as soon as possible. Use one of these options:

- Change your address online by logging in to myCalPERS.
- Contact us by phone at 888 CalPERS (or 888-225-7377).
- Download, complete, and return an Address Change Authorization (PDF) form by mailing or faxing it to the number shown on the form.

Set Up Direct Deposit

Maybe you're unsure of where you will be staying the night, or mail service has been delayed. The best way to ensure you receive your payment is by setting up direct deposit.

Active Employees: Contact your personnel office or financial institution.

Retirees: With direct deposit your monthly benefit payments are securely deposited at your financial institution.

There are two ways to sign up: **By mail:** Complete and mail the Direct Deposit Authorization (www.calpers.ca.gov/docs/forms-publications/direct-deposit-authorization.pdf).

Online: Log in to myCalPERS. Go to the Retirement tab and select Payment Options.

Once we receive your form, we'll send you a confirmation letter. If there's a problem with your form, we'll return it within approximately two weeks along with a letter explaining what we need

Run a Retirement Estimate

Thinking about retiring? Use the Retirement Estimate Calculator to get an idea of what your monthly benefit might be to be sure you're ready to retire. You can access the calculator two ways:

- Log in to myCalPERS to estimate your retirement benefits using the latest data reported by your employer. Follow our step-by-step How to Create a Retirement Estimate on myCalPERS (www.calpers.ca.gov/docs/forms-publications/howto-create-retirement-estimate.pdf) guide to get your estimate.
- Use our online calculator (www. calpers.ca.gov/page/activemembers/retirement-benefits/ service-disability-retirement/ retirement-estimate-calculator) by inputting information from your Annual Member Statement. Keep in mind you will receive more accurate information by using the calculator in myCalPERS. The Retirement Estimate Calculator is intended to provide only an estimate of your future retirement benefits. Your actual retirement benefit will be determined when you formally apply for retirement based on the California Public Employees' Retirement Law and federal tax law.

Apply for Retirement

You can apply for service retirement online, or by mail.

File Online

To file electronically, log in to myCalPERS. Go to the Retirement tab, select Apply for Retirement, and follow the steps for submitting your application and required documents online to us.

There are several benefits to filing for retirement electronically:

• Securely submit your application anytime, 24 hours a day.

Complete the online application at your convenience — start and

return at any point to complete it.


- Prior to submission, review and edit your information.
- Receive confirmation that your application has been successfully submitted.
- Submit additional required documents online.
- Use the Electronic Signature to eliminate the notary requirement for the member signature.

File by Mail



Million-Dollar Spaghetti

Ingredients

- 1 (8 ounce) package spaghetti
- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 1 (16 ounce) jar spaghetti sauce
- ½ cup butter, sliced divided
- 1 (8 ounce) container cottage cheese
- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened ½ cup sour cream
- 1 (8 ounce) package shredded sharp cheddar cheese

Directions

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook spaghetti in boiling water until cooked through but firm to the bite, about 12 minutes. Drain.
- Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat.
- Cook and stir beef in the hot skillet until browned and crumbly, 5 to 7 minutes; drain and discard grease. Transfer to a bowl and mix in spaghetti sauce.
- Place 1/2 of the butter slices into the bottom of a 9x13-inch casserole dish. Spread 1/2 of the spaghetti into the dish.
- Mix cottage cheese, cream cheese, and sour cream together in a bowl; spread mixture over spaghetti. Cover with remaining spaghetti and top with remaining slices of
- Pour ground beef mixture over spaghetti and spread in an even layer.
- Bake in the preheated oven for 30 minutes. Spread cheddar cheese on top and continue baking until cheese has melted and is lightly browned, about 15 minutes more.

CSR BILL WATCH

with Ted Toppin

The State Legislature went home for the year on September 14. Governor Newsom now has until October 14 to review and sign or veto all the bills that made it to his desk in the first year of the 2023-24 legislative session. Here is an update on the bills that CSR supported this year and may be of interest to CSR members:

<u>Support</u>

AB 46 (Ramos)

Would exclude from state taxation the gross retirement income received by retired members of the U.S. Armed Forces and recipients of the Department of Defense's Survivor Benefits Program. AB 46 will honor those who have dedicated their lives to serving our country while helping to retain and attract uniformed service retirees.

STATUS: Two-year bill. AB 559 (Boerner)

Would extend the sunset date for the California Senior Legislature Voluntary Tax Contribution Fund to remain on the state income tax return through 2030, to provide ongoing financial support to the California Senior Legislature.

STATUS: Signed by the Governor and Chaptered by the Secretary of State on July 21, 2023.

AB 616 (Rodriguez)

Would enact the Medical Group Financial Transparency Act, which would authorize the disclosure of financial reports and financial statements of providers and physician organizations collected by the Office of Health Care Affordability and financial and other records of risk-bearing organizations be made available to the Department of Managed Health Care.

STATUS: Awaiting Governor's action.

AB 820 (Reyes)

Would require the composition of various advisory groups and bodies to include an official or representative who advocates for, or administers programs that serve, older adults.

STATUS: Two-year bill. ACR 39 (Bains)

Would recognize the month of May

2023 as Older Californians Month. This bill will also encourage all Californians to recognize and treat all older adults with compassion and respect.

STATUS: Chaptered by the Secretary of State on June 1, 2023.

AJR 4 (Schiavo)

Would request the President of the United States to immediately end the Accountable Care Organization (ACO) Realizing Equity, Access, and Community Health (REACH) Model under the federal Medicare Program, with the goal of eliminating corporate profiteering and expanding consumer-directed access to care established through Traditional Medicare.

STATUS: Chaptered by the Secretary of State on September 7, 2023.

SCR 5 (Nguyen)

Would recognize the month of May 2023 as Older Americans Month and

encourages all Californians to recognize and treat all older adults with compassion and respect.

STATUS: Chaptered by the Secretary of State on June 1,

2023. SJR 1 (Cortese)

Requests the Congress of the United States to enact, and the President to sign, legislation that would repeal the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision from the Social Security Act.

STATUS: Chaptered by the Secretary of State on May 26, 2023.

Savvy Senior: Three Vaccines Seniors Should Consider Getting This Fall

Dear Savvy Senior, Which vaccines are recommended for Medicare seniors this flu season? Just Turned 65

Dear Just Turned,
There are actually three different
types of vaccines seniors should
consider getting this fall to protect
against a repeat of last winter's
"tripledemic" of respiratory
illnesses, which included flu,
RSV and coronavirus. Here's
a rundown of the different
vaccines the Centers for Disease
Control and Prevention (CDC) is
recommending and how they are
covered by Medicare.

Senior-Specific Flu Shots

For people age 65 and older, there are three flu vaccines (you only need one) that the CDC recommends over traditional flu shots.

These FDA-approved vaccines provide extra protection beyond what a standard flu shot does, which is important for older adults who have weaker immune defenses and have a greater risk of developing dangerous flu complications compared with younger, healthy adults. The three senior-specific options include the: • Fluzone High-Dose Quadrivalent vaccine, which contains four times the amount of antigen as a regular flu shot does, creating a stronger immune response for better protection.

- Fluad Quadrivalent vaccine, which contains an added ingredient called adjuvant MF59 that also helps create a stronger immune response.
- FluBlok Quadrivalent vaccine, is a recombinant protein (egg-free) flu vaccine that contains three times the amount of antigen as

as your doctor, health clinic or pharmacy agrees not to charge you more than Medicare pays.

New RSV Vaccines

Anyone age 60 and older, especially if you have any heart or lung conditions, diabetes, kidney or liver disorders that make you



compared with a regular flu shot. There isn't enough evidence yet to indicate whether one of these three vaccines provides superior protection over the other two for seniors.

As for side effects, you should know that the Fluzone High-Dose and Fluad vaccines can cause more of the mild side effects that can occur with a standard-dose flu shot, like pain or tenderness where you got the shot, muscle aches, headache or fatigue. While the side effects of Flublok tend to be a little less frequent.

All flu vaccines are covered 100 percent by Medicare Part B as long

vulnerable to the respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) should consider getting one of the new FDA approved RSV vaccines (either Arexvy or Abrysvo). These vaccines, recommended by the CDC, will help protect older and immunocompromised adults from respiratory illness, which is responsible for 6,000 to 10,000 deaths and at least 60,000 hospitalizations each year in seniors 65 and older.

The new RSV vaccines are covered by Medicare (Part D) prescription drug plans.

Updated Covid Booster

If you haven't had a Covid-19 booster shot lately, you should consider getting one this fall. Even though the Covid public health emergency has ended and the number of cases has gone way down, it has been surging in recent months causing an increase in hospitalizations, especially among the elderly.

The updated Covid vaccine targets the XBB omicron subvariants that are some of the most dominate coronavirus variants circulating in the U.S. It will also provide protection against the EG.5 variant (Eris), which is closely related to the XBB. Covid booster shots are covered 100 percent by Medicare Part B.

When and Where

Most health officials agree that it's safe to receive the flu and Covid booster at the same time. But because the RSV vaccines are new this year, many doctors are recommending a two-week window between an RSV shot and the flu and/or the COVID shots. You can find all three vaccines at most pharmacies, medical clinics and health departments, or you can do a search at Vaccines.gov.


