

Cybersecurity Awareness Month 2023: 6 Tips to Protect Your Personal Information Online

Why is data valuable?
"If you aren't paying for it,
you aren't the customer; you're the
product being sold."

You've likely heard of tech companies and apps selling user data without your knowledge or consent.

Tech companies are after your data because it's a major source of income. Third parties buy up this data to better understand their targeted demographics.

Whether it's social networking sites, search engines, or internet service providers (ISPs), the more data they receive the more they profit.

Those dog toy ads you're seeing as soon as you get a puppy? It's likely you searched online for something like "puppy training," and that data was passed from one company to another.

Tracking of our activity online is only increasing, which means access to that data is increasingly easy for people with bad intentions. The most common threats: identity theft, manipulation through ads, discrimination based on your personal information, and harassment.

What can you do to protect your

data?

Here are six ways to safeguard your information.

1. Don't provide personal information on your social media



profile. People who need your email address, birthdate, and phone number already have them. The more information you share online, the easier it is for someone to steal it

2. Be very careful who you share your Social Security number with—even the last four digits. Only share your number with your bank, a credit bureau, a company that needs to do a background check, or other entities that report to the Internal Revenue Service.

3. Watch out for phishing. Bad

4. Lock down your hardware. Set up your phone or PC to require a password to unlock. Devices are stolen just as much to re-sell the equipment as they are for the data they hold. Also, make sure you've installed anti-malware apps.

5. **Use multifactor authenti- cation**. It's a default setting for many online accounts—including myCalPERS—but make sure all your online accounts require you

to enter a code that has been texted or emailed to you. Multi-factor authentication ensures that if your password is stolen, a criminal won't be able to access your account without the code.

6. Be picky about the security questions you choose. Common questions like "What is your mother's maiden name?" or "In what city were you born?" are meant to keep your account safe from intruders, but they don't offer much security. The answer to these questions can be found in many online locations. Select questions only you would know how to answer, such as "What was the name of your first crush?" or, better yet, create a fib—only you need to know the answer you are giving.

CalPERS is committed to keeping your data private and secure, including using sophisticated cybersecurity systems and following industry best practices. Our Privacy Policy webpage has more information on what sorts of data we obtain, how we collect it, and how it's used.



Butternut Squash, Apple Cider, and Cheddar Soup

Ingredients

- 2 heads garlic
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 3 tablespoons softened butter, divided
- 5 cups diced butternut squash
- 1 cup diced onion
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 12-ounce bottle of pumpkin or apple ale
- 1 cup apple cider
- 2 cups chicken stock
- 2 cups extra-sharp white cheddar cheese, divided
- 4 slices ciabatta bread

Directions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cut the very top off both garlic heads. Drizzle with olive oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Wrap in a piece of foil and roast for 40 minutes or until soft. Once cool, squeeze all of the roasted garlic out of the heads. Set aside.
- Heat a large pot to a medium heat. Add 1 tablespoon butter, squash, onion, garlic and salt. Saute until slightly softened, about 7-8 minutes. Add beer, cider and chicken stock. Simmer until squash is softened, about 10-12 more minutes. Transfer to a blender and puree until smooth (you can also use an immersion blender). Return the soup to the pot and add 1 cup shredded cheese. Stir until melted, keep warm while you make croutons.
- Spread some of the roasted garlic on each piece of bread. Evenly divide the cheese between two slices of bread. Cover with top piece of bread, roasted garlic-side down. Spread with butter.
- Heat a medium non-stick pan to a medium heat. Add grilled cheese, buttered-side down. Spread more butter on other side. Cook until golden brown and cheese is melted, about 1-2 minutes per side. Cut into squares and serve with soup.

CSR BILL WATCH

First Year of 2023-24 Legislative Sessions Ends, Fun Begins Again in January 2024

The first year of the 2023-24 legislative session wrapped up on September 14. Governor Newsom then had until October 14 to sign or veto the bills that made it to his desk in the final weeks of session. In 2023, CSR supported 8 bills and monitored 24 others. Of those bills, five of them successfully made it through both houses of the Legislature and were ultimately approved.

This year, 3,030 bills were introduced and 1,326 were sent to the Governor for final action. He signed 1,170 and vetoed 156. Here is an update on the five CSR-supported bills that made it through the Legislature this year:

AB 559 (Boerner) Extends the sunset date for the California Senior Legislature Voluntary Tax Contribution Fund to remain on the state income tax return through 2030, to provide ongoing financial support to the California Senior

Legislature.

STATUS: Signed by the Governor and Chaptered by the Secretary of State on July 21, 2023.

ACR 39 (Bains) Recognized the month of May 2023 as Older Californians Month. This bill also encouraged all Californians to recognize and treat all older adults with compassion and respect.

STATUS: Chaptered by the Secretary of State on June 1, 2023.

AJR 4 (Schiavo) Requests the President of the United States to immediately end the Accountable Care Organization (ACO) Realizing Equity, Access, and Community Health (REACH) Model under the federal Medicare Program, with the goal of eliminating corporate profiteering and expanding consumer-directed access to care established through Traditional Medicare.

STATUS: Chaptered by the Secretary of State on September 7, 2023.

SCR 5 (Nguyen) Recognized the month of May 2023 as Older Americans Month and encouraged all Californians to recognize and treat all older adults with compassion and respect.

STATUS: Chaptered by the Secretary of State on June 1, 2023.

SJR 1 (Cortese) Requests the Congress of the United States to enact, and the President to sign, legislation that would repeal the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision from the Social Security Act.

STATUS: Chaptered by the

Signed bills will take effect on January 1, 2024.
The Legislature will reconvene for the second half of the 2023-24 legislative session on January 3, 2024. With the New Year comes a new State Budget proposal.
The Governor is constitutionally required to submit his 2024-25 budget plan to the Legislature no later than January 10.

Column Home Delivery Updates

How the program works

Starting Jan. 1, 2024, you must use Optum Home Delivery to fill a 3-month supply of your maintenance medications, paying only the copay equal to 2-month supply. You can choose to opt-out of home delivery and fill a 1-month supply of your maintenance medications at a retail pharmacy.

You can get 2 more monthly supplies from a retail pharmacy before you have to decide if you want to

You can get 2 more monthly supplies from a retail pharmacy before you have to decide if you want to use home delivery.

Once you use up those 2 fills, you have to decide if you want to use home delivery or if you still want to get 1-months' worth of your medication from a retail pharmacy. If you don't opt-out of home delivery, you might have to pay the full price for your medication.

Savvy Senior: How Seniors Can Get Help Paying for Everyday Needs

Dear Savvy Senior,
What types of programs are
available to help seniors struggling
with their everyday bills, and how
do I go about finding them? Since
I lost my husband last year, my
Social Security survivor benefit is
barely enough to get by on.

Dear Searching,

I'm very sorry for your loss, but you'll be happy to know that there are dozens of different financial assistance programs and government benefits that may be able to help you with your everyday costs.

To locate these types of programs, your best resource is BenefitsCheckUp.org. This is a free, confidential online screening tool designed for older adults and people with disabilities. It will help you find federal, state and local benefits programs that can assist with paying for food, utilities, health care, medications, housing and many other needs. This site – created by the National Council on Aging in 2001 – contains nearly 2,000 programs across the country. To identify benefits, you'll first need to type in your ZIP code and choose the types of benefits you're interested in. Then you'll need to answer a few questions regarding your personal and financial situation. Once completed, you'll get a list of programs to choose

from, followed by a personalized report that explains each program, and tells you where you can get help or how to apply.

If you need some assistance or you don't have internet access, you can always speak with a benefits support specialist by calling **800-794-6559**. You can also get

store. The average SNAP benefit for 60-and-older households is around \$105 per month. Some other nutrition programs that are available to seniors include the Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program and the Commodity Supplemental Food Program.

Types of Benefits

Depending on your income level, location and circumstance, here are a few of the many different benefits you may be eligible for:

Nutrition assistance: Programs like the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) can help pay for food at the grocery

Utility assistance: There's the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) that provides assistance in lowering home heating and cooling costs. And for broadband assistance, the Affordable Connectivity Program provides a \$30 monthly subsidy that can be applied toward your home internet costs.

Health care and medicine:

Medicare Savings Programs and Medicaid can help or completely pay for seniors' out-of-pocket health care costs. And for assistance with medications, there's





a low-income subsidy program called 'Extra Help' that helps pay premiums, deductibles, and copayments on Medicare (Part D) prescription drug coverage. You can also search for prescription drug help through patient assistance programs or your state pharmaceutical assistance program at Medicare.gov.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI): Administered by the Social Security Administration, SSI (see ssa.gov/ssi) provides monthly payments to very low-income seniors, age 65 and older, as well as to those who are blind and disabled. In 2023, SSI pays up to \$914 per month for a single person and up to \$1,371 for couples.

In addition to these benefits, there are dozens of other programs


